EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR/ADMINISTRATOR:

AUDITOR AND ACTUARY YEAR-END REPORTS - Mr. Sacco referred to the Audit Report as of December 31, 2016 that was emailed to the Executive Board prior to the meeting. He informed the Board that Mr. Jones from Nisivoccia and Company was present at the meeting to review the Audit Report. Mr. Jones began by reviewing the Statement of Revenue, Expenses and Changes in Net Position breakdown contained within the audit report. He informed the Board that the Fund has just over \$16.6 million in Net Position and is excellent financial condition as of the end of 2016. Mr. Jones then referred to the Auditors' Management Report which was also distributed to the Executive Board prior to the start of the meeting. He indicated that there were no findings or recommendations. Following Mr. Jones' presentation, Chairman Landolfi requested a motion to adopt the Resolution certifying the 2016 Audit and indicated that the Group Affidavit had to be executed.

MOTION TO APPROVE YEAR-END FINANCIALS, ADOPT RESOLUTION #18-17 AND EXECUTE GROUP AFFIDAVIT INDICATING THAT MEMBERS OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE HAVE READ THE GENERAL COMMENTS SECTION OF THE AUDIT REPORT.

ACTUARIAL IBNR ESTIMATES – Mr. Sacco indicated that the EJIF's Actuarial IBNR Estimates valued as of March 31, 2017 was enclosed within the agenda booklet. He noted that the Fund's actuary, Mr. Kullmann of Aon was present and asked him to give a brief report. Mr. Kullmann reported that the loss experience for the Fund has continued to be favorable. He noted that the favorable loss experience has resulted in the estimated IBNR being decreased from was 6.5 million at year-end 2016 to 5.9 million at as of March 31, 2017. He added that with regards to ultimate losses the changes represent a decrease of approximately 1.3 million in ultimate loss for known claims reported as of 12/31/16.

RFQ PROCESS- Mr. Sacco indicated that in 2014 the Executive Committee awarded contracts to the Fund professionals pursuant to the Fair and open process. He noted that the appointments were made for a three-year term for the professionals listed below. Mr. Sacco advised that the end of that term is approaching and we will need to advertise for all fund professional positions for the 2018, 2019, and 2020 fund years. The Fund will advertise pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.4 et. seq for the positions of:

Mr. Sacco added that these positions will be published based on the prior established criteria pursuant to a Fair and Open process.

REVISED BUDGET – Mr. Sacco referred to the revised 2017 budget enclosed within the agenda packet. He noted that the revisions reflect the changes in membership to the local JIF's for 2017 and asked for a motion to approve.

LEGISLATIVE AGENT RFQ (Page 13) – Mr. Sacco reported that the RFQ for the position of legislative agent was due on March 29, 2017. He informed the Board that there was one RFQ response received and it was from the incumbent, Princeton Public Affairs Group (PPAG). He advised that the Rules and Contract Committee reviewed the response and is recommending all year contract be awarded to PPAG.

MOTION TO AWARD A 1 YEAR CONTRACT TO PRINCETON PUBLIC AFFAIRS GROUP FOR THE POSITION OF LEGISLATIVE AGENT.

FINANCIAL FAST TRACK – Mr. Sacco referred to Financial Fast Track as of March 31, 2017 enclosed within the agenda booklet. He indicated that the Fund increased its surplus position by 1.4 million. He informed the Committee that the Fund's statutory surplus position is now over 18 million and added that the Fund is in excellent financial shape.

ATTORNEY:

Mr. Semrau reported that with regards to the Newark Bay claim, the attorneys continue to work on the recovery process. He advised that the process should be exhausted over the next few months.

UNDERWRITING MANAGERS:

Mr. Casagrande reported that the Coverage Committee met on 05/23/2017 to consider a number of action and informational items. He advised that the proposed Storage Tank Policy Form was reviewed and while favorably received, the committee asked for all the Fund Professionals to review the suggested form carefully before recommending adoption of this policy document by the September EJIF Meeting. He added that there is no intention to change coverage. Mr. Casagrande also reported that a suggested endorsement to the EJIF EIL Policy to cover temporary transit coverage was introduced for all to consider. He noted that the coverage would provide a \$250,000 sublimit for such coverage. Mr. Casagrande informed the Board that the Coverage Committee asked for a judicious review of the form and will also request the Underwriting Manager for the MEL for his recommendation. The intention is to introduce a finalized for adoption at the September EJIF Meeting. Mr. Casagrande reported that a discussion took place with regards to property screenings. He noted that the Fund Attorney has prepared a proposal that will be reviewed by the EJIF professionals. He added that much discussion followed as to the efficacy of this service, whether the service should be annually limited based on local unit size, and perhaps expanding the scope of services. No definitive consensus was achieved and the EJIF Chairman charged all to consider options to make this service more meaningful for the EJIF Membership. Lastly, Mr. Casagrande indicated that the final action item was a review of the inspection scoring process. He advised that the history of this process and the how the scoring was developed was reviewed. He informed the Board that Mr. Erickson has recommended that the Fund delay that process until the new stormwater and tank regulations are finalized in the near future.

ENVIRONMENTAL ENGINEERING:

Mr. Erickson reported that the DEP has issued a letter of guidance on UST requirements and training through Rutgers University.

Mr. Gulics reported that Risk Managers are now sending out UST and AST reports indicating what they believe the member has based on the Engineer's last inspection. He indicated that there are a lot of modification requests coming back via email. Mr. Gulics asked that the members pay close attention to that list to confirm accuracy.

Resolution of Certification Annual Audit Report for Period Ending December 31, 2016

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:5-4 requires the governing body of every local unit to have made an annual audit of its books, accounts and financial transactions, and

WHEREAS, the Annual Report of Audit for the year 2016 has been filed by the appointed Fund Auditor with the Secretary of the Fund as per the requirements of N.J.S.A. 40A:5-6 and N.J.S.A. 40A:10-36, and a copy has been received by each Fund Commissioner, and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey is authorized to prescribe reports pertaining to the local fiscal affairs, as per R.S. 52:27BB-34, and

WHEREAS, the Local Finance Board has promulgated a regulation requiring that the Fund Commissioners of the Fund shall, by resolution, certify to the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey that all Fund Commissioners have reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit entitled:

and

WHEREAS, the Fund Commissioners have personally reviewed, as a minimum, the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the Annual Audit entitled:

General Comments and Recommendations

as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the Fund Commissioners.

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the Fund Commissioners no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, as per the regulations of the Local Finance Board, and

WHEREAS, all Fund Commissioners have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of

New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board, and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the promulgations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the Fund Commissioners to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52 - to wit:

R.S. 52:27BB-52 - "A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year, or both, in addition shall forfeit his office."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Fund Commissioners of the New Jersey Municipal Environmental Risk Management Fund, hereby state that they have complied with the promulgation of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, dated July 30, 1968, and does hereby submit a certified copy of this resolution and the required affidavit to said Board to show evidence of said compliance.
