EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR/ADMINISTRATOR:

2015 PROPOSED BUDGET – Mr. Sacco indicated that at the September Executive Committee meeting, the Fund introduced a budget for Fund year 2015. He added that in accordance with the regulations, the budget has been advertised in the Fund's official newspaper and sent to each member JIF. Mr. Sacco advised that the Public Hearing for the budget would be held at this meeting and referred to the 2015 budget and assessments contained within the agenda packet.

EJIF DIVIDEND - Mr. Sacco informed the Board that the request for approval of the EJIF's \$475,000 dividend would be filed with the State for approval shortly.

NEXT MEETING - Mr. Sacco informed the Board that the next meeting of the EJIF is scheduled for November 19, 2014 at the Sheraton Hotel, across from the AC convention center at 12 noon.

FINANCIAL FAST TRACK – Mr. Sacco referred to the Financial Fast Track that was enclosed within the agenda packet. He informed the Board of the Fund's current statutory surplus position.

ATTORNEY:

Mr. Semrau informed the Board that with regards to the Newark Bay litigation, the attorneys are currently trying to recover costs from the insurance companies. He added that there have been some commitments but noted that funds have not been received yet.

UNDERWRITING MANAGERS:

REINSURANCE RENEWAL

Mr. Casagrande referred the Board to the Underwriting report contained in the agenda and the handout concerning coverage quotations which was distributed prior to the start of the meeting. He informed the Board that the renewal has a 1% increase for the 2015 policy year. Mr. Casagrande indicated that Liberty also provided 2 quotations for limits in excess of the current \$5,000,000. He noted that one option is for a \$10,000,000 limit and the other is for a \$7,500,000 limit. Mr. Casagrande added that he was pleased with the negotiations. Mr. Kickham indicated that the excess coverage should be discussed by the Coverage Committee as the offer would need to be declined or accepted.

ENVIRONMENTAL ENGINEERING:

Mr. Erickson advised that the Board of Public Utilities energy resiliency act provides a \$200,000,000 grant from FEMA to assist in energy resiliency for municipalities and authorities. He added that the purpose is for storm preparation.

Mr. Erickson informed the Board that the DEP currently has a bill that would double general permit fees in 2015. He noted that they are currently running a deficit for that program. Mr. Gulics added that the DEP is currently stepping up their enforcement to fund their program. He advised that they are visiting municipalities and authorities with regards to unpaid invoices. Mr. Gulics added that if a municipality or authority is using an environmental infrastructure trust loan, currently DEP is not closing those loans until air permits are filed for any proposed generators that are part of that funding.

Mr. Gulics referred to the Environmental Alert that was contained in the agenda booklet. He indicated that it is regarding recent changes in permit fees. Mr. Gulics noted that the changes affect emergency generators burning both distillate fuels and natural gas. He further noted that the DEP rescinded the general permit that covered both types of engines and then re-issued only the one covers distillate fuels as a general permit. Mr. Gulics added that the DEP is preparing to issue the second permit that deals with natural gas in 2015. He advised that if members have questions regarding the alert they should contact their designated Environmental Engineer.

Mr. Gulics advised that the DEP is also currently reviewing their municipal storm-water regulation program and developing significant changes for 2015. He added that it will focus on the member's storm-water facilities.
