2. Municipal Stormwater Webpage

- a. The permittee shall develop and maintain a stormwater webpage on its municipal website (see example stormwater webpage at www.nj.gov/dep/dwq/msrp_outreach_material.htm). This webpage shall at a minimum, make elements of the permittee's MS4 stormwater program available to the public by providing links to the latest version of each of the following:
- i. Stormwater Pollution Prevention Plan (SPPP) (excluding inspection logs and other recordkeeping documents);
 - ii. Municipal Stormwater Management Plan (MSWMP);
 - iii. Stormwater Control Ordinance (SCO);
 - iv. Pet Waste Ordinance;
 - v. Wildlife Feeding Ordinance;
 - vi. Litter Control Ordinance;
 - vii. Improper Disposal of Waste Ordinance;
 - viii. Containerized Yard Waste and Curbside Waste Collection Program Ordinances;
 - ix. Private Storm Sewer Line Retrofits Ordinance;
 - x. Illicit Connection Ordinance;
 - xi. Tree Ordinance (due on or before EDPA + 12 months as per Part IV.F);
 - xii. Salt Storage Ordinance (due on or before EDPA + 12 months as per Part IV.F);
 - xiii. MS4 Outfall Pipe Map;
 - xiv. MS4 Infrastructure Map (due on or before EDPA + 36 months as per Part IV.G); and
 - xv. Watershed Improvement Plan (due in accordance with the phases identified in Part IV.H).
- b. The permittee shall develop a stormwater webpage on its municipal website that contains links to the minimum elements in a. above on or before EDPA + 3 months for existing permittees and EDPA + 12 months unless a later date is specified above.
